MPC BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

The MPC Book Discussion Group will meet Monday evenings from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. starting October 20 and spacing the discussions out six weeks to give folks more time to read!

The first reading is *The Red Tent* by Anita Diamanta. A retelling of *Genesis 34* (also known as the rape of Dinah) from Dinah's perspective. Published in 1997, the book has been enjoyed by generations of women. Perhaps you have already read it?

The second meeting will be on December 1 to discuss *Man's Search for Meaning* by Viktor E. Frankl. Psychiatrist Viktor Frankl's memoir has riveted generations of readers with its descriptions of life in Nazi death camps and its lessons for spiritual survival. Based on the author's own experience and the experiences of others he treated later in his practice, Frankl argues that we cannot avoid suffering but we can choose how to cope with it, find meaning in it, and move forward with renewed purpose.

FOOD CENTER OPPORTUNITIES

The Food Center is run by a lively and committed group of volunteers, who find the work rewarding and fun. Most people only think of the Wednesday food distribution aspect of the Food Center, but there are many behind the scenes tasks that have to happen in order to be able to distribute food to clients on Wednesdays. Currently, there are several opportunities available:

- Inventory Control (at home, on your schedule)
 - Monitor pantry inventory (with the help of on-site volunteers)
 - Order free food from Philabundance weekly
 - Set up every other month deliveries from our grocery supplier
- Delivery Receiving (Monday mornings, and occasional Wednesday afternoons)
 - Be on site to accept and unload food deliveries
 - Maintain and communicate with a team of 2-3 helpers
- Food Pick-Ups (at your convenience, every other week)
 - Drive your vehicle, or the Food Center van, to Aldi to purchase bulk items
 - Unload and shelve food in the pantry.
